NUMBERS – NÚMEROS

<u>NUMBERS</u>	<u>SPANISH</u>	<u>PRONUNCIATION</u>
11	once	Own-say
12	doce	Doh-say
13	trece	Tray-say - (slight roll of the tongue on the "R")
14	catorce	Kah-tour-say
15	quince	Keen-say
16	dieciséis	Dee-yay-see-say-ee-se
17	diecisiete	Dee-yay-see-see-ay-tay
18	dieciocho	Dee-yay-see-oh-cho
19	diecinueve	Dee-yay-see-nway-vay
20	veinte	Vay-eeen-tay

The **Spanish numbers** 16 through to 19 are actually contractions.

For example, the Spanish for 16 - **dieciséis** - literally means **ten and six**, but is joined together, as shown below:

- dieciséis = diez y seis
- diecisiete = diez y siete
- dieciocho = diez y ocho
- diecinueve = diez y nueve
